The curriculum of our school is the one provided by CBSE and it is based on National Curriculum Framework 2020 and seeks to provide opportunities for students to achieve excellence in learning. CBSE envisions the all-round development of students in consonance with the holistic approach to education and therefore, has done away with artificial boundary between the co-curricular domain and the curricular domain.

CURRICULAR AREAS AT SECONDARY LEVEL

Secondary Curriculum provides students a broad and balanced understanding of subjects including languages, Mathematics, Science, and Social Science to enable students to communicate effectively, analyze information, make informed decisions, construct their world view in alignment with constitutional values and move ahead in the direction of becoming productive citizens. The recent focus of CBSE is on the development of 21st century skills in settings where each student feels independent, safe, and comfortable with their learning. Hence the curriculum is aligned in such a way that children feel more connected to it and employ their learning in real-life contexts. To achieve this aim, it is extremely important that children acquire adequate knowledge and skills in other core areas like Health and Physical Education, Life Skills, Value Education, Art Education, and Work Education.

The standard of education is carefully maintained to ensure academic excellence. The medium of instruction in the school is English. Apart from English, we also offer Tamil, Malayalam and Hindi. A student is expected to learn three languages up to class VIII. Besides scholastics, learner centered activities form an integral part of the school curriculum.

STRUCTURE OF ASSESSMENT SCHEME

The Assessment scheme will have an 80 marks component for Board examination (class X) and Annual Examination (class IX) in all subjects except compulsory subjects to be assessed internally along with a 20 marks component of Internal Assessment. Students have to secure 33 percent in total in each of these components.

The Board is progressively allowing more space to learning outcome based assessment in place of text book driven assessment. Question papers of Board examinations will have more questions based on real-life situations requiring students to apply, analyze, evaluate and synthesize information as per the stipulated outcomes. The core-competencies to be assessed in all questions, however, will be from the prescribed syllabus and text books recommended therein. This will eliminate predictability and rote learning to a large extent.

BOARD EXAMINATION FOR CLASSES X & XII

The Board Examination in each subject will cover entire syllabus of Class X & XII. Grades corresponding to the marks shall be on the basis of 9-point grading system. Grades will be awarded in each scholastic subject. For awarding the grades, the Board will put all the passed students in a rank order and will award the grades.

ASSESSMENT ON ART EDUCATION & HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

For the holistic development of the students, activities in the following areas will be carried out.

- a. Art Education (Visual and Performing Art)
- b. Health and Physical Education (Sports / Martial Arts/Yoga/NCC, etc.) It includes work Experience also.

The above co scholastic activities will be assessed by a 5-point grading scale.

DISCIPLINE (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values)

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and helps build character, sincerity, self-control, perseverance, good behavior and values. The concept of discipline should not be confused with strict authoritarian environment and the students should be given freedom to share their doubts and ideas with teachers regarding class works. Constitutional and universal values should also be encouraged amongst students. Hygiene, sanitation, dedication, honesty, truthfulness, kindness, empathy respect for the environment, elders and all living things etc. are the values that our students must actively practice. Parents may also support schools in cultivating disciplined behavior in their wards. Class teacher will grade the students on a Five-point scale (A to E) keeping in view the overall attendance, sincerity, values and behavior of the students. Value Education Resource Book and Kit developed by CBSE may be used for inculcating values in students.

CURRICULUM AREAS AT SENIOR SECONDARY LEVEL

For the purpose of fostering competenceis in learners, the curriculum encompasses seven major learning areas, which are: Languages, Humanities,

ELECTIVE AREAS:

- (i) Languages include Hindi, English and other 30 languages. The curricula in languages focus on listening, speaking, reading and writing skills for developing effective communicative proficiency. Learners use language to comprehend, acquire and communicate ideas.
- (ii) **Humanities and Social Sciences** Geography, History, Economics, Home Science, Sociology, Fine Arts, Political Science, and related subjects promote the learning of history and culture, geographical environment, global institutions, constitutional values and norms, politics, economy, interpersonal and societal interactions, civic responsibilities and the interplay of all these. Learners appreciate and value every human's right to feel respected and safe, and, in this regard, also understand their Fundamental Rights and Duties and behave responsibly. Learners learn to be tolerant and empathetic towards others through the study of these subjects.
- (iii) **Sciences:** Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, and Informatics Practices help in making students perceptive about matter and energy, nature, the environment, technological breakthroughs in science. The focus is on knowledge and skills to develop a scientific attitude and to use and apply such knowledge for improving the quality of life.

- (iv) Mathematics includes acquiring the concepts related to numbers, operations, computation, measurement, geometry, probability and statistics, the skill to calculate and organize and the ability to apply this knowledge and acquired skills in their daily life. It also includes understanding of the principles of reasoning and problem solving.
- (v) **Business and commerce based electives** Business Studies, Accountancy, Entrepreneurship, Economics and related subjects help in gaining understanding about core business disciplines. They understand the concept like, the exchange of items of value or products between persons or companies and the meaning / relevance/ significance of any such exchange of money for a product, service, or information.
- (vi) Visual, Performing and Creative Arts: Subjects like Dance, Drama, Music, Heritage Crafts, Fine Arts, Sculpture and related subjects aim to help learners cultivate an interest and appreciation for arts and encourage them to enthusiastically participate in related activities, thus, promoting abilities such as imagination, creativity, value arts, and the cultural heritage.
- (vii) **Skill Electives** help in development of professional competencies, which are analytical, applied and outcome based. Undergoing skills training in schools can help students learn about a trade progressively to create a product and also to become a problem solver in real life. At present many Skill electives are being offered by CBSE in the fields of Hospitality and Tourism, emerging technology like Artificial Intelligence, Geospatial Technology, Finance, Business, and Retail & Insurance etc. Students can also choose subject from diverse areas such as Fashion Design, Agriculture, Banking, Mass-Media Healthcare and many more students.
- (viii) **Health and Physical Education** focuses on holistic development, both mental and physical, understanding the importance of physical fitness, health, well-being and the factors that contribute to them. Focus of this area is on helping learners develop a positive attitude and commitment to lifelong, healthy active living and the capacity to live satisfying, productive lives with the help of health management,

indigenous sports, yoga, NCC, self-defense, fitness and lifestyle choices.

(ix) **General Studies:** The purpose of orienting students to General Studies is to develop in them an appreciation for the holistic nature of knowledge. In contemporary times, familiarity with General Studies is indispensable because at the senior school stage there is an element of specialization due to which the students do not get exposed to some vital disciplines/areas of study that are not covered in their specialized field. SCHEME OF STUDIES

Class XI and XII is a composite course. Students need to take only those subjects in class XI which he/she intends to continue in class-XII. Students can offer a minimum of 5 or more subjects in class XI. They need to continue the same subjects in class XII.

COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS

The following combinations cannot be taken together:

- Business Studies (Code 054) and Business Administration (Code 833)
- Out of three Computer Science/IT related subjects i.e. Informatics Practices (065), Computer Science (Code 083), and Information Technology (Code 802), a candidate can opt for only one subject.
- Biology (Code 044) and Biotechnology (Code 045)
- Mathematics (Code 041) and Applied Mathematics (Code 241)
- The first 5 subjects in the chronological order of filling the subjects in the online registration system/ Mark Sheet are considered as Main subjects.
- A candidate can also offer an additional elective which may either be a language at elective level or, any other elective subject.

CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY, LONDON'S ENGLISH LANGUAGE EXAM

We encourage all our students from grade III to XII to appear for Cambridge English Language Assessment Exams every year in order to develop their English language skills on par with international level. Certificates of these exams will be issued by Cambridge University, London. These certificates will be a boon to our students. The exams that our students take up are **Pre A1 starters**, **A1 Movers**,

A2Flyers, A2 Key for schools, B1 Preliminary for schools, B2 First for schools, C1 Advanced and C2 Proficiency. The above exams are scheduled to be taken up in the month of March every year.

SCHOOL FEE

The school fee structure is as per the schedule for each class. Fee is collected in advance on term basis. There are four terms of three months each starting from May, August, November and February. Fee may also be paid together for one year in advance.

ATTENDANCE

No student who has less than 80% attendance to his/her credit in a particular academic year shall be considered for promotion. Unauthorized absence for a period of 30 days will result in the removal of the pupil's name from the rolls without any intimation to the parent. Long absence may be condoned by the School Managing Committee up to class VIII.

THE SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

The morning session begins with the assembly for all the students and staff. During the assembly, the students are expected to observe proper decorum and solemnity befitting the occasion. At the end of the last period, the National Anthem is sung before the students are dispersed.

PARENT - TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

Parent - Teacher Association meetings will be conducted as per the schedule given in the diary. GENERAL RULES OF THE SCHOOL

- 1. Students who have completed at least six years by 30th September of the academic year may be admitted to Std. I.
- 2. It is essential that the Birth Certificate be submitted in original at the time of admission.
- 3. Annual fees should be paid in one stroke / installments as prescribed by the school on or before the scheduled dates.
- 4. Fees once paid will not be transferable / adjustable or refundable under any circumstances.
- 5. Parents are requested to ensure the academic follow-up of their wards at home.
- 6. Non vegetarian food may be avoided the in school premises.
- 7. Students are expected to come in neat and clean dress.
- 8. No student is permitted to wear gold chain, ring, bangle, anklet, costly watches, etc. However, girls may wear small ear rings.
- 9. Boys are not allowed to grow or colour their hair. Boys without proper haircut or with disfigured side locks/whiskers will not be permitted in class. They are also not permitted to grow beard.
- 10. Students' letters, parcels, etc. are subject to scrutiny by the Principal.
- 11. Students should not damage any property belonging either to the school or to other students.
- 12. Students should not throw papers or any waste materials on the floor of the class or on the ground. The dustbins kept for the purpose should be used.
- 13. Students from one class are not permitted to enter the other class rooms.
- 14. Children suffering from any contagious or infectious diseases will not be allowed to attend the school.
- 15. Irregular attendance, habitual negligence in school work, dishonesty, obscenity in words or action, insubordination or any kind of unwholesome practice are sufficient reasons for dismissal from the school.

LEAVE RULES

1. Students are expected to be regular in attending the school.

- 2. Prior sanction of leave need to be obtained when leave is unavoidable. For each leave, a leave application must be submitted on the next day, and compulsorily be signed by the parent.
- 3. No student shall leave the school campus without the permission of the Principal during school hours.
- 4. Half-day leaves, after coming to the school, may be granted only in extreme emergency and if the Principal is convinced of the same.
- 5. If a student is absent during a test/examination, no re-test/re- examination will be conducted.

FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

- 1. The parents/guardians are expected to co-operate with the school authorities to ensure proper discipline and better functioning of the school.
- 2. School timing is 9.00 a.m. to 3.35 p.m. Students are expected to arrive before 9 a.m.Late comers, without satisfactory reasons, will not be permitted to attend the classes.
- 3. Change of address or telephone number, need to be informed to the principal / class teacher.
- 4. Kindly acknowledge the circulars and notices sent through students.
- 5. Students are not allowed to bring magazines, periodicals, posters, cameras, transistors, cassette players, cassettes, I pad, CD's, mobile phones, etc. without prior permission from the Principal.
- 6. The use of mobile phones by students is strictly banned in the school campus.
- 7. Parents could meet the class teachers and the principal only after the school working hours i.e., after 4.00 p.m.
